1 Peter 2:9-12 (The Message)

9-10But you are the ones chosen by God, chosen for the high calling of priestly work, chosen to be a holy people, God's instruments to do his work and speak out for him, to tell others of the night-and-day difference he made for you—from nothing to something, from rejected to accepted.

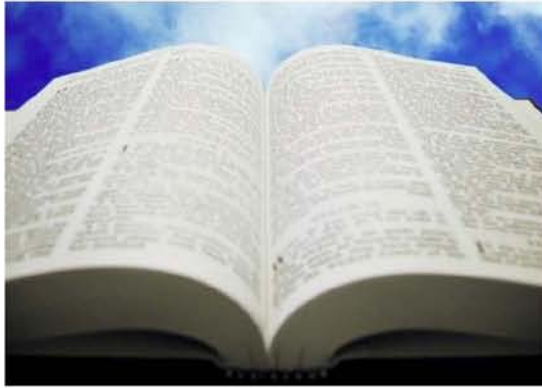
11-12Friends, this world is not your home, so don't make yourselves cozy in it. Don't indulge your ego at the expense of your soul. Live an exemplary life among the natives so that your actions will refute their prejudices. Then they'll be won over to God's side and be there to join in the celebration when he arrives.

The beatitudes simply show us how God's people ought to live in this world. People who want to live for God must be ready to say and do what seems strange to the world. Christians must be willing to give when others take, to love when others hate, to help when others abuse. By putting aside our selfish interests so that we can serve others, we will one day receive everything God has in store for us. To find hope and joy, the deepest form of happiness, we must follow Jesus no matter what the cost.



Jesus' way is dramatically opposed to the world's way. It is not usually the accepted, popular, convenient or even naturally human way. It is a higher way and the selfless way. It will take the giving up of our desires and submitting to God's ways.

When the world only speaks well of us we may have a problem. We may need to examine our lives to see if we are truly living our lives in accordance to God's ways. James says, "4You adulteresses, do you not know that friendship with the world is hostility toward God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God." James 4:4



We need to examine again, in the light of Scriptures, how God wants us to live and how to conduct ourselves in the world. As we obey God's ways, He will honour us and cause the world to see the reality and power of God through our lives. This is the only way to be a blessing to the nations.

WAC ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2010

ELECTORAL ROLL

The Electoral Roll determines those who are eligible to either vote or be elected at the AGM onto the Parochial Church Council (PCC). Baptized members who are at least 17 years of age, confirmed in the Anglican Church, and regularly attending Service and partaking Holy Communion in WAC, should be on the Electoral Roll.

NEW APPLICATION

The Electoral Roll is available at the Admin Counter. Please check if your name is on the Roll. If your name is not on the Electoral Roll, kindly approach Gladys or Priscilla.

NOMINATION OF OFFICE BEARERS

This AGM will be electing the following:

- (1) The People's Warden
- (2) 8 members of Parochial Church Council

*Please note that Article 1.5 of the Constitution: Candidates for election to PCC shall be on the Electoral Roll of the Parish and must be nominated by writing from one member and seconded by another to the Honorary Secretary AT LEAST EIGHT (8) DAYS prior to the AGM Meeting subject to prior written consent to nomination by the candidate. Nomination forms are available at the Admin Counter for members on the Electoral Roll who wish to stand for nomination forms by **10 April 2010**.*
